9:35 Welcome, introductions, and announcements (Chris Potter and Anne Sturm)

9:40 Update: Status of Eureka Littoral Cell Coastal RSM Plan (John Dingler, Clif Davenport, & Chris Potter):

-About one year ago, David Cannon (Everest) began discussing RSMP for Eureka. Since then, meetings have been held to discuss governance and ideas for the Eureka Plan. On April 21st, Clif, David, and Chris met with the Harbor Master and relevant stakeholders (USGS). Concern that the plan would be too prescriptive and HBIA met the following day to continue discussions. The draft governance structure is in progress. Clif will be off from July 18-Sept 1st. How will the RSM plans be adjusted to meet future needs due to Sea Level Rise? David will be holding one more workshop in SF (public meeting).

10:00 Federal updates

- **USACE LA District: Malibu Eco. Study is moving towards the TSP in July, public review will probably take place in September. East San Pedro Bay is working towards the alternatives milestone and has taken in many public comments, held workshops, and will continue to refine ideas for alternatives. Long Beach Deepening Project had its alternatives Milestone. San Diego, Shoreline, and Oceanside (?). Tijuana River PAS is in the middle of a three phase effort to study H&H, Floodplain, and Sediment Transport and is expected to wrap up in September with the possibility of a phase II for FY17.**
- **USACE SF District: Headquarters is in the process of re-writing guidance for RSM. Coastal Erosion and SLR conference attended by James Z., he learned that because there is not recreation at the HWY 1, because there is not a beach, it did not score very well economically. This is a USACE constraint and it struggles to put an accurate value on recreation. Question about if the federal breakwater caused the erosion to HWY 1? Even though it did, you still need to apply the same rules and analysis.**
